Indication: For use by any individuals age 18 years or older (self-collected), 14 years and older (self-collected under adult supervision) or 2 years and older (collected with adult assistance), including individuals without symptoms or other reasons to suspect COVID-19, for collection of anterior nasal swab specimens at home when determined to be appropriate by a healthcare provider and only for use in molecular diagnostic testing performed using an in vitro diagnostic (IVD) test for the detection of SARS-CoV-2 RNA that is indicated for use with the RapidRona Self-Collection Kit.

Authorized Laboratories: Testing is limited to laboratories designated by Diversified Medical Healthcare that are certified under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (CLIA), 42 U.S.C. §263a, and meet requirements to perform high complexity tests and that run the specimens collected from the RapidRona Self-Collection Kit on an in vitro diagnostic (IVD) molecular test that is indicated for use with the RapidRona Self-Collection Kit for collection of anterior nasal swabs when used consistent with its authorization.

Dear Dr. Holt:

On November 23, 2020, based on RapidRona, Inc.'s request the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for the RapidRona Self-Collection Kit pursuant to Section 564 of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (the Act) (21 U.S.C. §360bbb-3) for the indication stated in the letter.¹

On February 9, 2022, FDA received a request from you² to amend your EUA. In response to that request, and having concluded that revising the November 23, 2020, EUA is appropriate to protect the public health or safety under section 564(g)(2)(C) of the Act (21 U.S.C. § 360bbb-3(g)(2)(C)), FDA is reissuing the November 23, 2020, letter in its entirety with the amendments incorporated³ to authorize the emergency use of your product.⁴ Pursuant to section 564 of the Act, Scope of Authorization (Section II) and Conditions of Authorization (Section IV) of this reissued letter, your product is now intended for the indication above.

On February 4, 2020, pursuant to Section 564(b)(1)(C) of the Act, the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) determined that there is a public health emergency that has a significant potential to affect national security or the health and security of United States citizens living abroad, and that involves the virus that causes COVID-19.⁵ Pursuant to Section 564 of the Act, and on the basis of such determination, the Secretary of HHS then declared on March 24, 2020, that circumstances exist justifying the authorization of emergency use of medical devices during the COVID-19 outbreak, subject to the terms of any authorization issued under Section 564(a) of the Act.⁶

FDA considered the totality of scientific information available in authorizing the emergency use of your product for the indication above. A summary of the performance information FDA relied upon is included in the EUA Summary (identified below).

Having concluded that the criteria for issuance of this authorization under Section 564(c) of the Act are met, I am authorizing the emergency use of your product, described in the Scope of Authorization of this letter (Section II), subject to the terms of this authorization.

I. Criteria for Issuance of Authorization

I have concluded that the emergency use of your product meets the criteria for issuance of an authorization under Section 564(c) of the Act, because I have concluded that:

1. The SARS-CoV-2 can cause a serious or life-threatening disease or condition, including severe respiratory illness, to humans infected by this virus;
2. Based on the totality of scientific evidence available to FDA, it is reasonable to believe that your product may be effective in diagnosing COVID-19, by serving as an appropriate means to collect and transport human anterior nasal swab specimens so that an authorized laboratory can detect SARS-CoV-2 RNA from the self-collected specimen, and that the known and potential benefits of your product when used for diagnosing COVID-19, outweigh the known and potential risks of your product; and
3. There is no adequate, approved, and available alternative to the emergency use of your product.⁷

II. Scope of Authorization

I have concluded, pursuant to Section 564(d)(1) of the Act, that the scope of this authorization is limited to the indication above.

Authorized Product Details

Your product is a collection kit intended for use by any individual age 18 years or older (self-collected), 14 years and older (self-collected under adult supervision) or 2 years and older (collected with adult assistance), including individuals without symptoms or other reasons to suspect COVID-19, for collection of anterior nasal swab specimens at home when determined to be appropriate by a healthcare provider.

Anterior nasal swab specimens collected using the RapidRona Self-Collection Kit are transported at ambient temperature for testing at an authorized laboratory. SARS-CoV-2 RNA from the anterior nasal swab specimens is maintained in the specimen packaging and is only for use in molecular diagnostic testing performed using an *in vitro* diagnostic (IVD) test for the detection of SARS-CoV-2 that is indicated for use with the RapidRona Self-Collection Kit.

Testing is limited to laboratories designated by Diversified Medical Healthcare, that are certified under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (CLIA), 42 U.S.C. §263a, and meet requirements to perform high complexity tests. Testing is also limited to molecular diagnostic tests that are indicated for use with the RapidRona Self-Collection Kit for collection of anterior nasal swabs when used consistent with its authorization.

When using your product, individuals must follow all specimen collection and mailing instructions provided with the kit. The RapidRona Self-Collection Kit consists of materials (or other authorized materials as maybe requested under Condition J. below) required to collect, store and maintain the anterior nasal swab specimen, as described in the “RapidRona Self-Collection Kit Instructions for Use.”

“Authorized labeling” (available at <https://www.fda.gov/medical-devices/coronavirus-disease-2019-covid-19-emergency-use-authorizations-medical-devices/in-vitro-diagnostics-euas>). includes the following documents: the EUA Summary, the “RapidRona Self-Collection Kit Instructions for Use,” and the “RapidRona Home Collection Kit Inspection Form.”

The above described product, when accompanied by the authorized labeling as set forth in the Conditions of Authorization (Section IV) is authorized to be distributed and used under this EUA, despite the fact that it does not meet certain requirements otherwise required by applicable federal law.

I have concluded, pursuant to Section 564(d)(2) of the Act, that it is reasonable to believe that the known and potential benefits of your product, when used consistent with the Scope of Authorization of this letter (Section II), outweigh the known and potential risks of your product.

I have concluded, pursuant to Section 564(d)(3) of the Act, based on the totality of scientific evidence available to FDA, that it is reasonable to believe that your product may be effective in diagnosing COVID-19, by serving as an appropriate means to collect and transport human anterior nasal swab specimens so that an authorized laboratory can detect SARS-CoV-2 RNA from the self-collected specimen when used consistent with the Scope of Authorization of this letter (Section II), pursuant to Section 564(c)(2)(A) of the Act.

FDA has reviewed the scientific information available to FDA, including the information supporting the conclusions described in Section I above, and concludes that your product (as described in the Scope of Authorization of this letter (Section II)) meets the criteria set forth in Section 564(c) of the Act concerning safety and potential effectiveness.

The emergency use of your product under this EUA must be consistent with, and may not exceed, the terms of this letter, including the Scope of Authorization (Section II) and the Conditions of Authorization (Section IV). Subject to the terms of this EUA and under the circumstances set forth in the Secretary of HHS's determination under Section 564(b)(1)(C) of the Act described above and the Secretary of HHS's corresponding declaration under Section 564(b)(1) of the Act, your product is authorized for the indication above.

III. Waiver of Certain Requirements

I am waiving the following requirements for your product during the duration of this EUA:

- Current good manufacturing practice requirements, including the quality system requirements under 21 CFR Part 820 with respect to the design, manufacture, packaging, labeling, storage, and distribution of your product, but excluding Subpart H (Acceptance Activities, 21 CFR 820.80 and 21 CFR 820.86), Subpart I (Nonconforming Product, 21 CFR 820.90), and Subpart O (Statistical Techniques, 21 CFR 820.250).

IV. Conditions of Authorization

Pursuant to Section 564(e) of the Act, I am establishing the following conditions on this authorization:

Diversified Medical Healthcare (You) and Authorized Distributor(s)⁸

- A. Your product must comply with the following labeling requirements under FDA regulations: the intended use statement (21 CFR 809.10(a)(2), (b)(2)); adequate directions for use (21 U.S.C. 352(f)), (21 CFR 809.10(b)(5), (7), and (8)); appropriate limitations on the use of the device including information required under 21 CFR 809.10(a)(4); and any available information regarding performance of the device, including requirements under 21 CFR 809.10(b)(12).
- B. You and authorized distributors must make available, both with the shipped product and on your website(s) the “RapidRona Self-Collection Kit Instructions for Use” patient instructions.
- C. You and authorized distributors must inform authorized laboratories and relevant public health authorities of this EUA, including the terms and conditions herein, and any updates made to your product, or the authorized labeling.
- D. Through a process of inventory control, you and authorized distributors must maintain records of the numbers and locations to which your product is distributed.
- E. You and authorized distributors must maintain customer complaint files on record. You will report to FDA any significant complaints about usability or deviations from the established performance characteristics of the product of which you become aware.
- F. You and authorized distributors are authorized to make available additional information relating to the emergency use of your product that is consistent with, and does not exceed, the terms of this letter of authorization.

Diversified Medical Healthcare (You)

- G. You must notify FDA of any authorized distributor(s) of your product, including the name, address, and phone number of any authorized distributor(s).
- H. You must notify FDA of any authorized laboratories designated by Diversified Medical Healthcare to use your product, including the name, address, and phone number of any authorized laboratories.
- I. You must provide authorized distributor(s) and authorized laboratories with a copy of this EUA and communicate any subsequent changes that might be made to this EUA and its authorized accompanying materials.
- J. You may request changes to this EUA for your product, including to the Scope of Authorization (Section II in this letter) or to the authorized labeling, including requests to make available additional authorized labeling specific to an authorized distributor. Such additional labeling may use another name for the product but otherwise must be consistent with the authorized labeling, and not exceed the terms of authorization of this letter. Any request for changes to this EUA should be submitted to the Division of Microbiology (DMD)/Office of Health Technology 7 (OHT7)-Office of In Vitro Diagnostics and Radiological Health (OIR)/Office of Product Evaluation and Quality (OPEQ)/Center for Devices and Radiological Health (CDRH) and require appropriate authorization from FDA prior to implementation.
- K. You must comply with the following requirements pursuant to FDA regulations: 21 CFR 820 Subpart H (Acceptance Activities, 21 CFR 820.80 and 21 CFR 820.86), Subpart I (Nonconforming Product, 21 CFR 820.90), and Subpart O (Statistical Techniques, 21 CFR 820.250).
- L. You must have lot release procedures and the lot release procedures, including the study design and statistical power, must ensure that the kits released for distribution have the clinical and analytical performance claimed in the authorized labeling.
- M. If requested by FDA, you must submit lot release procedures to FDA, including sampling protocols, testing protocols, and acceptance criteria, that you use to release lots of your product for distribution in the U.S. If such lot release procedures are requested by FDA, you must provide it within 48 hours of the request.
- N. You must have a process in place to track adverse events, including any occurrence of false results with your product and report to FDA pursuant to 21 CFR Part 803. Serious adverse events, especially unexpected biosafety concerns, should immediately be reported to DMD/OHT7-OIR/OPEQ/CDRH (via email:CDRH-EUAREporting@fda.hhs.gov).
- O. You must submit to FDA a summary report within 30 calendar days of this letter summarizing the results of any testing performed using anterior nasal specimens collected with the RapidRona Self-Collection Kit during that timeframe, including how

many kits were requested and sent for home collection to individuals, how many kits were shipped and returned according to the instructions, how many specimens had to be rejected during accession and the main reasons for rejection, and the positivity rate for the RapidRona Self-Collection Kit.

Authorized Laboratories

- P. Authorized laboratories testing anterior nasal swab specimens collected using your product must have in place a suitable specimen receipt and accessioning SOP when accepting specimens for testing.
- Q. Authorized laboratories using your product must use it only in conjunction with COVID-19 in vitro diagnostic (IVD) molecular tests that are indicated for use with your product.
- R. Authorized laboratories will collect information on the performance of your product and report to DMD/OHT7-OIR/OPEQ/CDRH (via email: CDRH-EUA-Reporting@fda.hhs.gov) and you (help@rapidrona.com) any suspected occurrence of false positive or false negative results and significant deviations from the established performance characteristics of your product of which they become aware.

Diversified Medical Healthcare (You), Authorized Distributors, and Authorized Laboratories

- S. You and authorized laboratories using your product must ensure that any records associated with this EUA are maintained until otherwise notified by FDA. Such records will be made available to FDA for inspection upon request.

Conditions Related to Printed Materials, Advertising and Promotion

- T. All descriptive printed matter, advertising and promotional materials, relating to the use of your product shall be consistent with the authorized labeling, as well as the terms set forth in this EUA and the applicable requirements set forth in section 502(a), (q)(1), and (r) of the Act, as applicable, and FDA implementing regulations.
- U. No descriptive printed matter, advertising or promotional materials, relating to the use of your product may represent or suggest that this test is safe or effective for the detection of SARS-CoV-2.
- V. All descriptive printed matter, advertising and promotional materials, relating to the use of your product shall clearly and conspicuously state that:
 - This product has not been FDA cleared or approved but has been authorized by FDA under an EUA;

- This product has been authorized only for the collection and maintenance of anterior nasal swab specimens as an aid in the detection of nucleic acid from SARS-CoV-2, not for any other viruses or pathogens; and
- The emergency use of this product is only authorized for the duration of the declaration that circumstances exist justifying the authorization of emergency use of medical devices under Section 564(b)(1) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, 21 U.S.C. § 360bbb-3(b)(1), unless the declaration is terminated or authorization is revoked sooner.

The emergency use of your product as described in this letter of authorization must comply with the conditions and all other terms of this authorization.

V. Duration of Authorization

This EUA will be effective until the declaration that circumstances exist justifying the authorization of the emergency use of medical devices during the COVID-19 outbreak is terminated under Section 564(b)(2) of the Act or the EUA is revoked under Section 564(g) of the Act.
